Janet Tomcavage is the Senior Vice President and Chief, Value-Based Care Strategic Initiatives for Geisinger Health System. In this role, she has responsibility for strategy development and oversight for Geisinger's system-wide value-based re-engineering initiatives. This includes population health management functions for Geisinger Health Plans including ProvenHealth Navigator® (Geisinger's advanced medical home), disease and case management, wellness, medical management, clinical informatics, and population health information systems development. Ms. Tomcavage also has administrative accountability for Geisinger's hospital platforms care transitions including utilization and care management. Her role also involves specialty care redesign including performance management, pay for performance and other payment models.

In addition to her role with Geisinger Health System, Ms. Tomcavage is also Chief of Population Health at xG Health Solutions™, an independently operated venture that will make Geisinger's intellectual property and expertise available to other healthcare systems. At xG Health, she has led efforts to export Geisinger's population health tools and services specifically related to primary care practice redesign, care management and clinical informatics.

Ms. Tomcavage earned her bachelor of science in nursing from Bloomsburg State University and her master of science in nursing from College Misericordia. She has co-authored many publications on patient - centered primary care, diabetes, disease management and the expanded role of nursing in health care. Ms. Tomcavage has lectured nationally on successfully driving transformation within health care and leveraging population health to achieve high quality and affordable health care.

Ms. Tomcavage was the first nurse at Geisinger to win the Pennsylvania Nightingale Award for clinical excellence in an advanced nursing role in 1994. She is an active member and has served in various leadership roles in the American Nurse Association, the American College of Healthcare Executives, the Alliance of Community Health Plans, and the PA Chronic Care Collaborative.
